
SUPPORT THE VICTIM

LET THE PERSON ON THE RECEIVING END OF THE ABUSE KNOW THAT YOU DISAGREE WITH WHAT THE PERPETRATOR IS SAYING. THEY WILL FEEL SUPPORTED AND HOPEFULLY LESS DISTURBED BY THE ABUSE.

TAKE EVIDENCE

 ASK THE BUS DRIVER FOR THE BUS AND DRIVER NUMBER.

 IF IT IS SAFE, TAKE VIDEO OR PHOTO EVIDENCE OF THE INCIDENT ON YOUR SMART PHONE.

 SWAP CONTACT DETAILS WITH THE VICTIM SO YOU CAN SEND THEM YOUR EVIDENCE. THEY MIGHT CHOOSE TO USE THIS IN A COMPLAINT TO THE BUS COMPANY OR HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION.
